

# **Annual NZBTT Brain Tumour Research Grant 2023**

The New Zealand Brain Tumour Trust aims to make a real and positive difference to the lives of people of all ages diagnosed with a brain tumour. Through the generosity of supporters and donors, the NZBTT is able to make available annually, a one-off research grant of \$10,000 to support the efforts of scientists undertaking research in the area of brain tumours. This encompasses both malignant and benign tumours that involve any part of the brain (ie. cerebrum, cerebellum, brainstem, pituitary gland, hypothalamus etc).

# INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS

The New Zealand Brain Tumour Trust (NZBTT) invites applications from principal investigators in the field of brain tumour research.

Closing date 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2023.

A grant of \$10,000 is available for projects that are achievable within a one-year time frame. The grant will be for salaries of research workers. Applications solely for equipment or travel will not be considered.

If awarded the grant, the NZBTT will require (1) a one-paragraph updated lay abstract (approx. 150 words) by 1 December 2023, submitted electronically on the progress of your research written in terms understandable by laypersons, who are not specialists in your field of study, and (2) an image of yourself, your research team or your research - both abstract and image for inclusion on the NZBTT website.

The NZBTT requires the researcher to report on the outcomes of their research project in person, at a NZBTT Fundraising Event of the Trust's choosing. This may be in person or presented via Zoom.

The NZBTT expects that the financial support given by the Trust will be acknowledged in any media coverage and resulting scientific publication(s) or conference abstracts.
